## MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

When I was little, I was always so eager for the day to set up the Christmas crib (crèche) at my home. It was not a fancy crib. We didn't have room even for ourselves as we had only three rooms at home. We didn't even have our own bedrooms. But still we were able to find room for the crib. Every day we prayed before the crib, and I was always sad when they took the crib out. One of our parishioners was telling me that she was still using the same crib that she and her husband bought 60 years ago.

What memories do you have of the crib? How many of us have a crib? How many of us have the crib inside our home? Is the crib just decorative or does it mean something to you? Where should we keep the crib in the church? The crib (Nativity scene) in a church should be in a prominent, accessible spot for devotion but outside the main sanctuary to avoid distracting them from Mass. It should enhance worship, fitting the theme of humble beginnings. So here at St. Joe's I have our people to set up the Nativity scene at the altar. I will explain.

The tradition of the Christmas crib is closely connected to St. Francis of Assisi. In the year 1223, in the small town of Greccio, St. Francis created the first living Nativity scene. His desire was simple yet profound: to help people see and feel the humility of God made flesh. When I went to Assisi, I was so moved to see the Church where St. Francis had his first living nativity scene. Francis was deeply moved by the poverty of Christ. He wanted hearts to be touched not by words alone, but by the sight of a Child laid in a manger. For Francis, the crib was not decoration, it was catechesis. It preached the Gospel without a sermon, teaching that God chose weakness, simplicity, and love over power and prestige.

For me, the crib at the altar is not distracting but serving the purpose of St. Francis' intention. It's evangelizing. By placing Jesus in a feeding trough, the crib reminds us that Christ comes to nourish us. He becomes our food, our life, our hope. The God who could have entered the world in splendor chose instead to be held, to be vulnerable, and to be loved.

When we set up the crib in our homes and church, we continue St. Francis' vision. We are invited to slow down, to kneel, and to allow the mystery of the Incarnation to shape our hearts. The crib calls us to simplicity, gratitude, and compassion—especially toward the poor and forgotten. After Christmas Mass, please bring your kids closer to the crib, and explain the love of God towards His people. This Christmas, may we stand before the crib with the eyes of St. Francis: full of wonder, humility, and joy. There, in the silence of Bethlehem, we rediscover the heart of our faith—God with us.
