MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

One of the beautiful things I truly cherish happens every Friday during the school year when our St. Joe's Catholic School children come into the church for Friday School Mass. As they arrive, the teachers pause with them at the door, inviting them to touch the holy water and bless themselves. Then, as they walk into the church, they genuflect before entering their pews. They do this faithfully every time they come for School Mass.

One weekend, I noticed one of our St. Joe's students attending Mass with her family. Without anyone reminding her, she walked in, blessed herself with holy water, and genuflected before being seated. It made me wonder—and I invite you to reflect as well: How many of us remember to genuflect or bow as we enter the church? And more importantly, do we understand why we do this?

When we step into the church, our eyes are often drawn to the sanctuary where the tabernacle is placed. That small, often decorative, structure is not merely a beautiful ornament or decoration, it is the dwelling place of Jesus Himself in the Eucharist. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "The tabernacle is to be situated in churches in a most worthy place with the greatest honor, and it should foster adoration before the Lord truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar" (CCC 1183).

The word tabernacle means 'dwelling place.' In the Old Testament, God instructed Moses to build a tent—a tabernacle—where His presence would rest among His people as they journeyed through the desert. Today, in our Catholic churches, the tabernacle continues to be that sacred place where the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist remains, outside of Mass, so that the faithful may pray, adore, and find strength in His nearness.

This is why we genuflect before the tabernacle whenever we enter or leave the church. It is an act of humility and reverence before the Lord who waits for us there, silently, patiently, and lovingly. Before that small golden door, heaven touches earth.

A few weeks ago, I noticed that the inside of our tabernacle in the church was not as neat as it should be. Over the years, it has developed several black spots—likely due to age and constant use. At present, we keep one ciborium and two lunas (the holders for the Blessed Sacrament when placed in the monstrance) inside the tabernacle.

Ideally, we could use a little more space, and I've been thinking that it might be time to consider a new tabernacle for our parish. However, new tabernacles are not inexpensive—the one we've been looking at costs around \$20,000. I truly don't want to take this amount from our parish savings, so I place this intention before you, our parish family.

If you feel called and are willing to sponsor the tabernacle or contribute toward its cost, your generosity would be a tremendous blessing for our parish and an act of great love for our Lord in the Eucharist. Please prayerfully consider how you might help us make this beautiful investment for our church. I invite you this week to spend some quiet time in church before the tabernacle. He is there for you—always.

ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL

Three weeks into the school year and our students have jumped right into their learning. From beginning of the year assessments and projects in the classroom, to preparing for upcoming liturgies, our students are growing as disciples of Christ.

This year, we are blessed with an enrollment of fifty-eight students in grades 4K-5th. In addition to our dedicated classroom teachers, we are fortunate to have specialists in music, art, physical education, technology, and library who broaden and enrich our students' learning, as well as an educational resource specialist who helps us meet the unique needs of our students. In addition, our two classroom aides provide daily support and care for our students and staff. This team of educators and students is united in Christ, growing together in faith, excellence, and service.

What makes St. Joe's truly special is that everything we do is rooted in Christ. Catholic education matters because it not only forms strong minds, but faithful hearts, and a mission of service. Our students learn the importance of prayer, service, and virtue alongside their academics, preparing them for a life of discipleship. The gift of Catholic education provides children with an anchor of faith, and a vocation to reflect the light of Christ in all that they do.

As we move forward in faith, let us be mindful of our calling to be a source of light and hope to our world.
