was excited to start my ministry in our country in 2010. I was looking forward to getting my driving license because comparing to Indian roads, our roads are great. The first place I drove myself after getting my license was McDonald's. One weekend I was supposed to celebrate Weekend Mass in Neillsville. So, I had to drive from Marshfield to Neillsville on a snowy cold day. It was only half an hour drive, but it took me a little more than an hour, not because of the snow but because of the GPS I was following. Now, most of the time I will not use GPS. How many of you have been using GPS?

Some used GPS even more than 2000 years ago and they reached their destination. During Advent, we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ—the Light of the world. One of the most beautiful Advent images is that of the Three Wise Men journeying across deserts and mountains, guided by a star. Their story reminds us that faith is a journey, and every journey needs direction so that we can reach our destination.

Today, we have GPS devices that tell us exactly where to go, when to turn, and how long it will take to get there. But unlike our GPS, God's guidance doesn't always come with a clear voice or a glowing map on a screen. The Wise Men had a GPS—a star and a promise. They didn't know exactly where the star would lead them. They couldn't calculate the distance or predict the obstacles. Yet, they trusted and followed. Their "GPS" was God's Positioning Spirit—the quiet prompting that said, "Keep going. You're on the right path."

Advent invites us to tune in to that same divine GPS. God still speaks through the Word, through prayer, through the nudging of the Holy Spirit, and sometimes through the people He places in our path. The challenge is to pause long enough to listen. There are many fake stars (GPS) that may distract us and promise to take us where most of the world is traveling towards. Are you following the right GPS?

The Wise Men teach us three things about following God's direction: Be attentive – They noticed the star because they were looking for signs of God's presence. Are we looking for Jesus in this Advent season? Be courageous – They left behind the comfort of home and followed wherever God led. Leave your wish behind and follow God's will in this season. Be humble – When they found the Child, they bowed down and worshiped. While shopping for gifts, while driving, at family Christmas gatherings, try to see Jesus in everyone and respect them. Don't get mad at anyone.

This Advent, let's allow God to guide us—not just to Bethlehem, but to the deeper places of faith, hope, and love. May we follow the light of Christ even when the road is uncertain, trusting that His guidance will never fail us.

# **CLASSROOM CONNECTIONS**

# <u>Kindergarten and First Grade – Mrs. Scharlau</u>

This year our classroom has been busy with both Kindergarten and First Grade. We have been learning rules and expectations and how to work together in a multi-aged classroom.

We have been learning about the different genres of literature including poetry, informational texts, Fables, Nursery Rhymes and Fairy Tales. Through our reading adventures we have learned life lessons from the characters that we have met. These texts have also provided opportunities for us to learn, practice, and build our reading and writing skills.

In kindergarten we have been practicing counting to 100 and learning to recognize and write numbers to 20. In first grade we have been practicing adding and subtracting and fact families to 10. Although we have been working hard on the academics, we have also had the opportunity to build amazing friendships.

# Second Grade- Mrs. Hildebrandt

econd grade is a very special year in our student's faith journey as they prepare to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion for the first time. The children have been learning about God's love, forgiveness, and presence in their lives. As they prepare for their First Reconciliation they are learning about making good choices, saying "I'm sorry," and experiencing the joy of God's mercy in Reconciliation.

These past few weeks the curriculum has seemed to align as it rarely does so perfectly. In Literacy and Social Studies students have been learning about our government. They are reading and writing informational essays about the history of our country and the government.

A classroom favorite is Math Tag. The children use their math fact skills to move around the room. With each correct answer the students take a step. With each step they move closer to another student, eventually tagging him/her.

# 3rd Grade- Miss Randall

This year the third graders learned about ecosystems and created their own ecosystem box with animals, plants, and landforms! Students studied the Tundra, Ocean, Rainforest, Desert, and more. After completion of the ecosystem, they worked on an essay explaining their project.

In Social Studies, we have been learning about communities. Students designed a poster to show how jobs are important to a community. They enjoyed researching about teachers, nurses/doctors, police officers, and firefighters!

Lastly, we have been exploring the value of money, counting money, and making change. Students practiced adding and subtracting in word problems to determine how much money in all or the amount of change they should receive. We love doing real-world applications to help us be successful when we get older!

### 4th Grade- Mrs. Sobota

The fourth-grade class is excited to start their Owl Pellet Dissection Lab where they will be learning about animal adaptations and basic skeletal structures.

They are also looking forward to the annual Rosary-A-Thon where the students make rosaries for the entire day. They also invite their families to join them and teach them about making rosaries.

They have finished their Altar Server training and are enjoying serving at our school Masses on Fridays and weekend Masses too.

### 5th Grade- Mrs. Wyss

The 5th grade students were given a class set of knitting looms. After learning how to use them, they have been hard at work making hats to donate to those in need!

They also chose a city in America to learn about and made a power point presentation on it. They were able to learn, firsthand, how different geographic factors influence the location of settlements.

The students learned about the history and importance of Veterans Day in our classroom and worked hard to prepare and present a wonderful Veterans Day program honoring all those who served.

# Educational Resource Specialist- Mrs. Brogan

Te have been busy in the Resource Room so far this year. Students have been working hard in small groups and completing testing and assessments. We have started a new program called UFLI to build strong reading skills. I am proud of the hard work and excitement the kids bring each day!

### Technology-Mr. Parker

ur students are charging full speed ahead in the computer lab this year! Kindergarteners are kicking off their typing adventure, building confidence with every keystroke. The 1st and 2nd graders are sharpening their keyboarding skills with the mantra "Right hand, right finger, right key." Meanwhile, our 3rd–5th graders are creating impressive Word documents and dynamic PowerPoint presentations that showcase creativity and confidence.

### Library-Mr. Parker

his year, the library has become a world of exploration and excitement! Students began their journey by discovering every section of the library, turning curiosity into confidence. They've been diving into thrilling tales like *Fantastic Mr. Fox* and *Voyage of the Frog*, sparking imagination and a love for reading. Soon, these adventurers will pause to reflect on the season of Advent—a time to grow in faith and prepare their hearts for the joy ahead.

## Physical Education- Mrs. Wengel





# **FAITH FORMATION**

Vere told that Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation. For those of us who are parents, it might resonate with us as we look back on the arrival of each of our children, but probably felt most strongly with our firstborn. The wondering who they're going to look like. Worried about whether we have gotten everything that we are going to need to properly take care of them. Pangs of excitement, anxiety, fear, doubt and a myriad of other emotions. Ultimately, the arrival of that little one tends to bring about a sense of fulfillment of where we are meant to be at that point in our lives. This is how we should feel about the arrival of the baby Jesus during this season.

By now we know the signs of the Advent season, but do we know the symbolism behind them?

Evergreens are used to form a wreath - a never-ending circle with no beginning and no end. This is exactly how we're meant to think of God's love for us - eternal, never-ending. When we think of green plants we think about the new life of springtime. The evergreen of the wreath reminds us of this same new life promised to us, as we see less and less light during the early winter days, with the coming of the Christ child.

In this time of increasing darkness the four candles of the Advent wreath bring with them light, diminishing the darkness. Most often there are four candles; three purple and one pink but some add a fifth white candle in the center be lit on Christmas Eve or Day to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

During Advent, much like during Lent, purple calls us to a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. Purple has long signified the color of royalty because it was oftentimes difficult, and expensive, to produce. During His Passion, the soldiers even used a purple cloak to clothe Jesus, along with the crown of thorns, to further mock him, as they called him the King of the Jews (Mark 15:16-20).

The first candle we light, the candle of Hope, is also called the "Prophet's Candle." In the Old Testament, the prophet Isaiah foretold of a coming Savior lending hope to all who believe (see Isaiah 7:14). It is this hope that we embrace during the Advent season. Without Jesus, our hope for salvation has a much dimmer glow.

The candle of Peace, also called the "Bethlehem Candle," is ignited during the second week of Advent as Mary and Joseph take to their journey to Bethlehem for the census.

Week three, Gaudete (pronounced gow-DAY-tay) Sunday, brings the rose-colored candle of Joy, sometimes called the "Shepherd's Candle." Oh, the joy the shepherds must have felt after the angel told them of Jesus's birth! (see Luke 2:15-20)

The last purple candle of Love, the "Angel's Candle," echoes the praises of the angels, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:14) Consider the love that God has for us when he sends the angel Gabriel to visit Mary. Or the angel that visits Joseph. This is the love God intends for us in John 3:16-17, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

Have a blessed Advent season and may you have abundant joy in the love that our Lord, Jesus Christ has for each one of us.




