

MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

Look around—everyone is busy. Calendars are full. Phones are buzzing. Work is nonstop. Kids have activities even during weekends. The grocery list never ends. Weekends aren't restful and we even have no time for church; they're packed. And yet, in all this busyness, one question quietly lingers: Are we actually happy? Are you happy?

Busyness can look a lot like purpose. It gives us a sense of motion, achievement, even status. But if we never pause to reflect, we risk confusing a full schedule with a full life. Busyness can distract us from the deeper life God desires for us. A full calendar doesn't always mean a full heart. Sometimes, in the rush to do everything, we forget to simply be—to be with God, to be with one another, and to be present in the moment.

Happiness, real happiness, often comes in the quieter moments—the ones we rush past. It shows up in conversations without distraction, in a breath of fresh air when we finally step outside, in laughter not shared through a screen, but across a table. Maybe it's time we checked in—not just with our to-do list, but with ourselves. Are we content? Are we present? Are we living on purpose or just on schedule?

Because in the end, being busy is not the goal. Being well, being present, being joyful—that's the life we really long for. Even Jesus took time to step away from the crowds and rest in the presence of His Father (Luke 5:16). If the Son of God made time to be still and pray, how much more do we need that sacred pause?

This week, consider what truly matters. Can you create space in your schedule to rest, to pray, to connect—really connect—with God and those around you? Happiness isn't found in a frantic pace. It's found in the quiet places where God's voice can be heard. I keep insisting sitting before the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration. Could you please find one hour to spend before the Blessed Sacrament? You will definitely find a difference in your lives.

As Psalm 46:10 reminds us: "Be still and know that I am God." Let's not just be busy Christians. Let's be joyful, Spirit-led, and rooted in the peace that only Christ can give. This week, take a moment to unplug. Say no to one thing. Say yes to stillness. You may discover that beneath the noise of busyness is a life waiting to be felt more deeply. I am reading Matthew Kelly's book: *Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy*. Let me know if you are interested and I will be happy to share the book with you.

ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL



Did you know that St. Joseph Grade School is an accredited institution?

Accreditation means that our school meets high standards of quality set by an independent educational organization. It ensures that we provide strong academic programs, sound operations, and a faith-filled environment for our students. Regular reviews and reports help us stay accountable and continually improve in fulfilling our mission.

Why Does Accreditation Matter?

- Assures all school stakeholders that the school operations are fully connected to the school's mission statements
- Recognizes and affirms the excellent programs and unique qualities of the school
- Åffirm the contributions of the teachers, staff, administration and the entire school community in the implementation of the school's mission statements
- Demonstrates the high quality of the school culture, the learning environment and educational program of the school
- Gives future direction to the entire school program by providing a process to develop long-range educational and financial plans
- Provides accountability to the school's many and varied publics
- Provides opportunities for professional growth for the school community
- Gathers information to be used in creating a plan for future development

As an accredited school, St. Joseph Grade School submits an annual report to the Wisconsin Religious and Independent Schools Accreditation (WRISA) organization each October. This report is reviewed by WRISA to determine whether our accreditation will be fully renewed or if recommendations for improvement are needed. Every seven years, accredited schools also participate in an in-depth evaluation conducted by a visiting team of 3–5 professionals who observe daily operations, review documentation, and interview various members of the school community.

Over the past year or so, our staff has been engaged in a comprehensive self-study, a thoughtful and rigorous process in which we reflect on our mission and evaluate our progress across 9 Defining Characteristics, 4 Domains, 13 Standards, and 70 Benchmarks. This work ensures that we continue to grow and strengthen as a Catholic school committed to excellence in faith and academics.

An essential component of this process is gathering feedback from our stakeholders, which includes all of you, our valued parish community. Your input through this survey directly informs our self-study and helps us prepare for our upcoming accreditation visit in December. We kindly ask that you take a few moments to complete the survey. You can access the survey using the link, QR Code, or pick up a paper copy in the office. Please know that your responses are completely anonymous. The survey will close on Friday, October 24th.






October 12, 2025 - Week 2: Praying with the Mission Church

United in Prayer with the Missions As World Mission Month continues, we are invited not only to give but to pray for the Church mission territories. One powerful way to do this is by praying the World Mission Rosary, introduced by enerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen in 1951. Each decade is a different color, representing a region of the world.

In Evangelii Nuntiandi, St. Pope Paul VI reminds us that prayer is the soul of all mission: "It is the Holy Spirit who, today just as at the beginning of the Church, acts in every evangelizer" (75). Through our prayers, we unite ourselves with missionaries bringing the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

Let us offer our rosaries and Masses this week for those who bring Christ's love to the margins, often at great personal cost. And let us ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle the fire of hope in our own hearts, that we may also be missionaries, wherever we are.
