

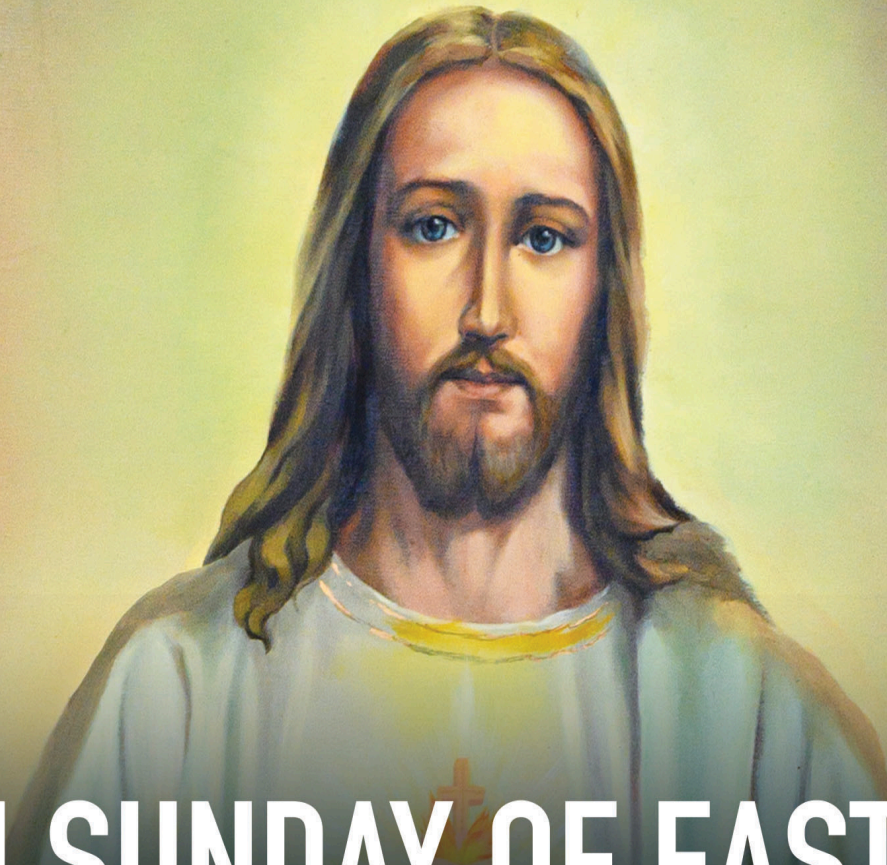

When I was preparing my homily for the Divine Mercy Sunday, I happened to read this : “Every soul You have entrusted to me, Jesus, I will try to aid with prayer and sacrifice, so that Your grace can work in them.”— St. Faustina, Diary, 245. “We do not know the number of souls that is ours to save through our prayers and sacrifices; therefore, let us always pray for sinners.” Diary, 1783. Have you ever read these lines before?

I feel the weight of an Invisible Assignment, given to each one of us. St. Faustina’s words are revealing that God entrusts certain souls to your intercession. This means that our prayer life is not just about our relationship with God, but also about the eternal destiny of others. We are not just a pilgrim on our personal journey to holiness, but we are custodians of souls. Jesus revealed to Faustina that through her hidden life of prayer and sacrifice, many would receive the grace of conversion. We are called to the same sacred task. How many souls are bound to your spiritual diligence or negligence?

“We do not know the number of souls that is ours to save...” — Diary, 1783. This line should stop us cold. You may be the only person praying for a stranger’s salvation—a soul in darkness, addiction, despair, or sin. You may never meet them, never know their story. But God assigned them to you. Our prayers make the difference between conversion and collapse. And grace needs a human channel—someone to say “yes,” someone to kneel, someone to fast, someone to offer their pain. If not us, then who?

Faustina’s power didn’t come from herself—it came from union with the Eucharistic Jesus. Every offering she made was laid upon the altar of His sacrifice. When we attend Mass and offer our intentions, when we unite our sufferings with Christ crucified, we become an active participant in the redemption of others. Every time we whisper “Jesus, have mercy on us and on the whole world,” we are sending out spiritual shockwaves, reshaping eternal destinies.

How to take Faustina’s call seriously: Write a list of names—family, friends, enemies, leaders, unknowns—and pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet or Rosary with them in mind. Offer small sufferings—hunger, discomfort, insults, delays—for a soul in danger. At the moment of the Offertory, mentally place souls on the paten. As the priest lifts the chalice, offer God the people you carry. You are placing them on the altar of mercy. (I personally do this during every Mass). At the end, we may be stunned at who stands beside us in eternity—souls we never met, who were rescued by our hidden offerings.

Heaven is counting on us. We have been entrusted with lives.

To walk alongside our students as they grow in faith, knowledge, and love for Christ, to partner with families who entrust us with their children, and to be supported by a parish that believes in the importance of Catholic education, have all been sacred privileges. This has never simply been a position for me, but a vocation that I have cherished with all my heart.

I move forward with peace and deep confidence in the future of our school. The legacy of forming young disciples, nurturing servant hearts, and striving for excellence will continue to flourish.

Please know how deeply thankful I am for St. Joseph Parish. You have shaped this journey in ways I will carry with me always. It has been an honor and a joy beyond measure to serve you, and I will keep this parish and school in my prayers with great love and gratitude.

## LISTENING SESSIONS

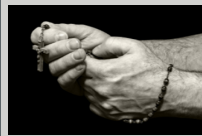
**L**istening sessions are going to be held regarding the proposal to purchase the blue and white houses located on the same block as the church.

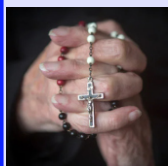

Fellowship and refreshments will follow in the entrance of the church.

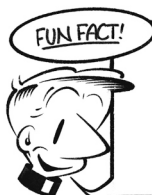
