

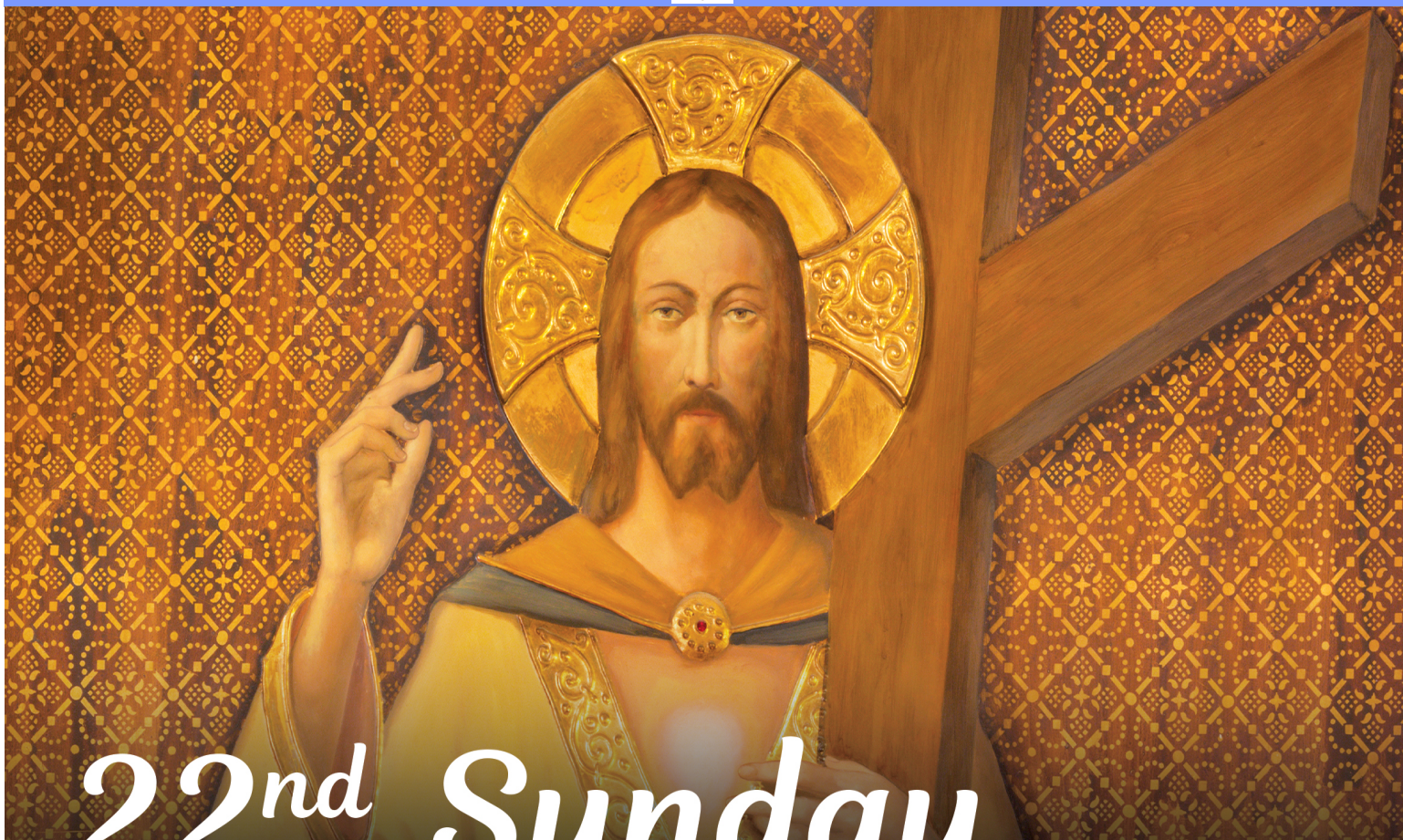

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MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

We live in a world of full-time jobs and part-time commitments. We have full-time teachers, full-time nurses, full-time farmers, full-time business owners, and full-time parents. But there is one question worth asking ourselves: Are we full-time Christians? Sometimes we can become “part-time Christians.” We pray when we need something. We come to Mass when it is convenient. We remember God when life is difficult, but when everything is going well, we may forget Him.

But Jesus never called us to be part-time disciples. Being a Christian is not something we do only for one hour on Sunday. Christianity is a way of life. It should influence how we speak, how we treat our family, how we do our work, how we use our money, how we respond when someone hurts us, and how we treat people who disagree with us. A full-time Christian does not mean that we are perfect. As I preached last Sunday, God doesn’t want us to be perfect but faithful. It means that we try to bring Christ with us wherever we go.

When we are at work, Christ should be there. When we are at home, Christ should be there. When we are driving, Christ should be there. When we are dealing with a difficult person, Christ should be there (this is very difficult for me). When nobody is watching, Christ should still be there.

St. Paul reminds us, “Whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God.” Our faith cannot be separated from our daily lives. Perhaps this week we can ask ourselves a simple question: “If someone watched my life from Monday through Saturday, would they recognize that I am a Christian?” What are those moments that make us part-time Christians?

Our faith should not be something we put on when we come to church and take off when we leave. This world does not need more people who simply call themselves Christians. The world needs Christians who live like Christians. Let us strive to be full-time followers of Jesus—not perfect Christians, but faithful Christians. Let our words, our actions, our kindness, our forgiveness, and our love become a living witness to Christ.

A few more tips to be full-time Christian: Begin the day with God. Make Sunday Mass the center of your week. Practice your faith at home. Watch your words. Serve someone every day. Remember God when nobody is watching. WHICH OF THESE HAVE YOU BEEN DOING ALREADY?

Sponsors needed for St. Joseph Parish and School Service Project

The local Rotary clubs have joined in partnership to serve the community in fighting hunger through meal-packing events. Since this partnership began in 2011, over 1.3 million meals have been packed locally. The primary beneficiary of these meals have been local food pantries, such as Stepping Stones and Feed My People Food Bank. Also through Stepping Stones, meals have been provided to the Boyceville and Colfax food pantries as well as the Share A Meal (SAM) program through the Menomonie School District. One great accomplishment of Rotary Feeds has been the ability to pack more meals than we need locally. In the past we've had a surplus of meals that have been donated to areas where disaster relief is needed both nationally, such as Houston after hurricane Harvey, and internationally like Nepal, Syria, and Haiti.

**We hope to pack 12,000 meals costing
\$3,000 on November 7th, 2026**
