# **MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO**

This week, the Church invites us to reflect on two beautiful and deeply connected celebrations: the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14 and the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15.

For me, this feast has a very personal meaning. On September 14, 2010, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, I left India to begin my ministry here in the Diocese of La Crosse. My ordination motto has always been "In His footsteps" — walking with Christ and carrying the Cross. Before I left, my mother reminded me to keep following Him faithfully, no matter how heavy the Cross may become. Her words remain in my heart, and I pray every day for the grace and strength to carry every cross with faith, trusting in God's blessings. These feasts are inseparably linked because the Cross of Christ and the heart of His Mother meet at Calvary, where love and suffering are transformed into salvation.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross reminds us that what once symbolized shame, defeat, and death has become the sign of hope, victory, and eternal life. In the world's eyes, the Cross was an instrument of torture; in God's eyes, it became the doorway to redemption. When we look upon the Cross, we do not see despair, but we see love poured out. Do you have a cross at your home? How often do you look at the cross when you pray? How many times a day, do you draw the sign of the cross?

Immediately after, we turn our gaze to Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, who stood faithfully at the foot of the Cross. While the world mocked and abandoned Jesus, Mary remained. She did not run away from the pain; she shared in it. Do you know any mothers who are going through difficult moments. I also remember all those mothers who are carrying their crosses on behalf of their family and children. Her seven sorrows — from Simeon's prophecy to laying her Son in the tomb — teach us that true discipleship means staying close to Jesus, even when the path leads through suffering.

These two celebrations remind us of something very important for our own lives. Every cross we carry sickness, grief, family struggles, disappointments—has meaning when united with Christ's Cross. Every sorrow we endure can be transformed into grace when we, like Mary, stay close to Jesus in faith and trust. When you enter the church this week and see the crucifix, pause for a moment. Whisper a simple prayer: 'Lord Jesus, I adore Your Holy Cross. Give me the courage to carry my own and the faith to see Your victory in my struggles.'

And don't forget to turn to Mary, Our Mother of Sorrows, who walks with us when life feels heavy. She teaches us that the Cross is never the end and resurrection always follows. May we, like Mary, stand at the foot of the Cross with unwavering faith, and may the sign of the Cross always remind us that God's love has the final word.

We are blessed that our 5th grade students have been trained as altar servers, while our 4th graders are beginning their training for this special role. Serving at the altar is a beautiful way for our young people to take an active role in the liturgy, deepen their faith, and witness to others by their reverence and service to God. As altar servers, they also become role models for younger students, showing a beautiful way to joyfully participate in the celebration of Mass.

This Tuesday from 2:00–3:00 PM, students in grades 2–5 will participate in our first Eucharistic Adoration of the school year. Together, they will spend this holy hour in prayer before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, with Benediction and Reposition. Adoration gives our students the gift of silence, reflection, and simply *being* with Jesus. We are deeply grateful to Father Mano for leading us in this sacred time. Special thanks as well to Mrs. Wacek and our teachers, who guide and prepare the students for this experience, and join them in prayer. Later this school year, our kindergarten and first grade students will also begin participating. We warmly invite our parish community to join us for Eucharistic Adoration every third Tuesday of the month at 2:00 PM.

Dear Faith Formation Families,

Along with the new security measures being added for our church and school, we're also making a few updates in Faith Formation to help keep our children safe while they're here with us.

We started putting the new procedures in place this past week. Here's what you can expect for our **Elementary** and **Middle School** groups:

**Drop-off**: Please walk your child inside through the main entrance to check them in.

**Pick-up**: At the end of class, you'll come in through the gym doors (Door 4) to check out with your child's catechist.

Once classes begin, the outside doors will be locked. If your child happens to arrive late, just ring the doorbell and we'll gladly let you in.

If your child needs to leave early, or if someone other than you will be picking them up, please let Tammy in the Parish Center know ahead of time so we can be prepared. Students being picked up early may be picked up at the front entrance.

Thank you so much for your cooperation and for helping us create a safe and welcoming environment for all of our children!

CONFIRMATION will begin on Sunday, September 14 after 8:30 Mass from 9:30 - 11:15 am. This will be for both students in grades 9 and 10 AND their parent(s). Registration can be turned in that day, if it hasn't been already. If you have any questions please contact Tammy in the Religious Ed office.

**ELEMENTARY** will meet on **Wednesday**, **September 17** from 5:30 - 6:30 pm and there will be a parent meeting for those who have students in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.
