

MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

How many of you love hot morning coffee when you watch the news? That's my regular schedule. Last Tuesday, they were saying in the news that Cambridge Dictionary had announced 'parasocial' the word of the year for 2025. I had to google it to find out the meaning of this word. We live in a time when many of our "connections" come through a screen. We follow YouTubers, athletes, influencers, commentators, or even fictional characters with a closeness that can feel surprisingly real. Psychologists call this a parasocial relationship: a one-sided bond in which we feel we "know" someone who does not know us.

On the surface, this seems harmless. After all, enjoying a show or admiring a public figure is perfectly normal. But parasocial connections can quietly shape our hearts if we are not attentive. First, they can give us the illusion of companionship without the demands or blessings of true relationships. True Christian friendship, like the kind St. Paul speaks of in his letters—is mutual, sacrificial, and rooted in love for God and one another. Parasocial bonds can copy intimacy while leaving us isolated. Many of us might have so many Facebook friends and followers on Insta but in reality, how many true friends do we have to stand by us in our difficulty?

Second, these one-sided attachments can affect our expectations. We may compare ourselves to curated online images, or expect the people around us to entertain, inspire, or affirm the way a polished personality does. Real human interaction can then feel messier or less exciting. But Jesus calls us to real encounter—the kind that requires patience, vulnerability, forgiveness, and grace.

Finally, parasocial relationships can influence our worldview more strongly than we realize. Voices we let into our hearts shape our habits, our desires, and even our faith. Jesus reminds us, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." If someone on a screen receives more of our emotional energy than the people God has placed in our lives, it may be time to pause and reorient.

Please don't misunderstand me. I don't mean that we must reject media or stop appreciating public figures. The best relationships are the ones that help us grow in holiness—those rooted in presence, shared life, and grace. So perhaps this week, consider: Who are the real people God is inviting me to notice, listen to, and build up? Where can I invest myself more deeply in authentic Christian fellowship? Christ came to us not as a distant personality, but as a Person—Emmanuel, "God with us." He shows us the beauty of real presence. May we seek the same in our friendships and in our parish family. Safe hunting.



We have the opportunity to join the Tri-Parish (Durand, Mondovi, and Lima) and travel to Steubenville, OH to participate in the Catholic Youth Conference being held at Franciscan University June 26-28, 2026.
