MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

When I was little, my parents could not take us on many trips because they did not have enough money. But they never failed to take us to Churches and famous Shrines. Once we went to a famous Shrine (Our Lady of Good Health, Velankanni). It is referred to as the "Lourdes of the East." I was shocked to see millions of pilgrims. Their feast day is September 8th.

It's my joy to share those three miracles that happened in the Shrine. The Shepherd Boy (16th Century): A young boy resting under a banyan tree near a pond reported a vision of the Virgin Mary holding the Infant Jesus. She requested milk for her child; after he obliged, he reached his master's home to find his milk pot overflowing.

The Buttermilk Vendor: A boy with a physical disability sitting under a banyan tree near the road was visited by Mary requesting buttermilk for her child. Upon giving it to her, the boy was cured of his lameness and instructed to inform a wealthy Catholic gentleman to build a chapel for Mary. In the 17th Century a Portuguese merchant ship caught in a violent storm in the Bay of Bengal prayed to the Virgin Mary for rescue. They landed safely at Velankanni on September 8th (the Feast of the Nativity of Mary). In gratitude, they built a permanent stone chapel on the site of the earlier thatch structure.

You would be surprised by the some of the devotions of the people. Some pilgrims walk for miles barefoot; some kneel-walk before Our Lady; some light candles or offer wax figures representing the healing they seek; others pray the Rosary, make their Confession, receive Holy Communion, or participate in the great processions. Some come asking for a favor, while others return simply to say, "Thank you."

One of the most beautiful things about Velankanni is that people of many different backgrounds come to pray before Our Lady of Good Health. Catholics, Hindus, Muslims, and people of other faiths visit the shrine. They may understand Mary in different ways, but many come with the same human needs: they are looking for hope, healing, peace, and someone to whom they can entrust their loved ones.

For us Catholics, Mary is the Mother of Jesus and our spiritual mother. At the foot of the Cross, Jesus gave Mary to His disciples, saying, "Behold, your mother". Because of this, Catholics have always turned to Mary with the confidence of children approaching their mother.

There is something deeply moving about seeing people from different religions standing together before Our Lady. A mother does not ask her children, "Where are you from?" before listening to their cries. She welcomes them. Mary's role, however, is never to keep us away from Jesus. She always points us toward her Son. At Cana, she told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." That remains Mary's message to every person who approaches her: Come to Jesus. Trust Him. Follow Him.

ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL

The momentum of the school year continues to build as we approach the completion of our first full week of school. This year, we are blessed with an enrollment of **53 students in 4K through fifth grade**. Our close-knit community of students truly looks out for one another as sisters and brothers in Christ—whether on the playground, in the lunch line, or on the school bus.

Every Friday, our Kindergarten through fifth-grade students come together to celebrate Mass. A tremendous amount of effort goes into the planning and preparation for these celebrations. We are incredibly grateful for the skill, dedication, and commitment of **Beth Wacek**, who works diligently with our students and provides meaningful opportunities for them to minister and actively participate in the Mass.

Along with the growing momentum of the school year comes the driving force of the **St. Joe's PTO**. We are deeply grateful for the investment of **Kristin Woelfel, Corinn Wengel, and Jen Parker** as they generously serve our students and create opportunities for our families to come together.

Since the start of the school year, the PTO has already worked to establish a **Uniform Closet**, where families can donate gently used uniforms and students can access clothing as needed. They have also organized a **St. Joe's Apparel Sale**, giving families the opportunity to purchase clothing featuring the St. Joe's logo.

On **Tuesday, September 8, from 5:30–7:00 p.m.**, the PTO will sponsor our first-ever **Pizza, Playground, PTO Picnic**. Building a strong sense of community at St. Joe's School is incredibly important, and we are excited for this opportunity to bring our families together as we continue this wonderful journey throughout the school year.
