# MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

In the city of Milan, Italy, there is a magnificent cathedral with a unique entrance. To reach the main aisle, one must pass through three doors, each bearing an inscription beneath its arch. Over the first door is a beautiful wreath of roses, with the words: "All that which pleases, is but for a moment." Over the second door stands a cross, beneath which is written: "All that which troubles, is but for a moment." Over the third door, the grand entrance to the heart of the cathedral are the profound words: "That only is important, which is eternal."

Do I live with eternity in mind, letting it shape my choices, my beliefs, and my actions? Or am I too entangled with the unimportant distractions of life, giving more attention to the peripheral than the essential?

The Jewish Law required tithing a tenth of the produce of the land, usually grains, oil, and wine. Even today, there are many non-Catholic churches practicing this. But the religious leaders, in their zeal for external observance, went further, even tiny garden herbs like mint, dill, and cumin. While meticulous in these small practices, they neglected justice, mercy, and faith. Jesus does not condemn external devotions—our prayers, rosaries, offerings, and church services. These are good and valuable when they lead us to deeper faith. But He warns against letting them become empty rituals, disconnected from the heart of the Gospel.

I may spend hours praying and reading Scripture, but does it make me humble, forgiving, and loving? I may give generously to the Church and participate in grand celebrations, but do I also reach out to the poor, the lonely, and the hurt? I may collect statues, relics, rosaries, and holy medals but do they inspire me to greater sacrifice, dependence on God, and genuine service to others?

Jesus invites us to move from peripherals to essentials, to shift from outward displays to inner transformation and to live not just as observers of religion but as disciples of Christ. This path is not always comfortable. It asks us to surrender pride, embrace humility, and sometimes let go of things we value. But it is the only way to build a life that lasts.

As we pass through the 'three doors' of life, we are invited to remember: What pleases us is temporary. What troubles us is temporary. What truly matters is eternal.
