A wise priest-psychologist once told me that there are two realities he finds difficult to speak about, because they cannot truly be learned from a talk or a book. They are love and prayer. Would you agree? Think for a moment of the most loving people you have known, perhaps two or three. They did not become deeply loving by attending seminars on love or by reading articles about it. So how did they learn?

First, by living close to someone who loved deeply. Fr. Paul Albera, the second successor of Don Bosco, once spoke about his childhood under Don Bosco's care. Don Bosco was poor. The boys had simple lodging, plain clothes, and often little more than polenta to eat during harsh winters in Turin. An interviewer once asked Fr. Albera how they managed in such difficult conditions. His face lit up as he replied: "We were caught up in a current of love. We felt loved in a way we had never been loved before."

Materially, they had little. Spiritually and emotionally, they had everything. Many of us live and work in communities, and families. Ask yourself: Have you experienced that "current of love" where you live? I once heard a religious Nun speak about her formation. She said simply, "The best formation I received was from my mother. She taught me how to love."

Love is easy to define but difficult to live. To love means to sincerely desire and actively work for the good of those entrusted to us. Sooner or later, people know whether our concern is real or merely professional. If we are Christians, our most important qualification is not a degree or a title. It is whether we are genuinely loving people.

Shortly before his death, Don Bosco had a dream that later became central to Salesian education. In the dream, he walked through his oratory and noticed that the boys did not seem happy. Distressed, he asked his mysterious guide: "Are the Salesians working hard for the boys?" "Yes." "Do they love the boys?" "Yes." "Then why are the boys not happy?" The answer was simple and profound: "It is not enough that you work hard. It is not enough that you love them. They must know that they are loved."

Love must be expressed in ways the other can understand. Love that is not felt is incomplete. Think again of those people by whom you felt truly loved. They are your real teachers. My bulletin column may give you ideas about love, but it cannot make you loving. That requires daily practice.

If you truly desire to grow in love, examine two things: Are you consciously trying to imitate the most loving person you have known? In the decisions you made in the last twenty-four hours, were you guided more by love or by self-interest? Give honest answers.

As we journey together through this sacred season of Lent, the students at St. Joe's are invited each day to open their hearts to the theme, "Walking with Jesus." During morning announcements, we prayerfully reflect on a passage from Scripture, followed by a question or task that encourages us to live out our faith in word and deed. This daily practice offers a beautiful opportunity for our students to grow closer to God, deepening their understanding of Lent as a time of prayer, sacrifice, and service.

Each Thursday of Lent, our school community will gather in church at 2:30 pm to pray the Stations of the Cross. Mrs. Wacek has created slides that are meaningful to our elementary students, and different classes will lead the Stations each week. We invite you to join us if your schedule allows.

During Lent, our students in grades 2-5 will also receive the sacrament of Reconciliation, which is a powerful encounter with God's mercy and grace. In examining their hearts and seeking forgiveness, our students experience the loving embrace of our Heavenly Father.

Students also received mite boxes to support the Missionary Children's Association, a global organization dedicated to helping children in need.

Through these Lenten practices, our students are not only learning about their faith; they are growing in a personal relationship with Jesus, who calls each of us to seek Him, serve others, and open our hearts to His endless love.

May this season of Lent remind us that small acts of kindness, prayer, charity, and sacrifice can transform our hearts, and the hearts of others.


