MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

Who preserved the Holy Cross after Jesus' death? Have you ever thought about this? Jesus died on the cross and then He was buried. The Apostles ran away and hid until Pentecost. Did they ever think about taking care of the Holy Cross? Where did it go? How did they find out? I always share this with our school kids while I visit their classrooms and they love it.

According to 4th-century historians, Saint Helena (mother of Emperor Constantine) traveled to Jerusalem around 326 AD. She ordered the demolition of a Roman temple dedicated to Venus, which Emperor Hadrian had built over Golgotha, and discovered three wooden crosses in a cistern underneath. To determine which of the three crosses belonged to Jesus, Bishop Macarius of Jerusalem touched all three to a dying woman. Legend holds that two crosses had no effect, but the third instantly cured her, leading leaders to proclaim it the True Cross.

A popular medieval Christian legend known as the Legend of the True Cross tells us the connection between the Holy Cross and Seth (Adam and Eve's third son). This is not biblical so don't blame me. I liked the way that Legend connects. As Adam lay dying, he sent his virtuous son Seth back to the gates of the Garden of Eden to beg Archangel Michael for the "Oil of Mercy" to heal him. Archangel Michael refused the oil, explaining that salvation was centuries away. Instead, the angel gave Seth a seed (or a branch) taken directly from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil—the very tree whose fruit Adam and Eve had eaten.

When Seth returned, he found Adam had already died. Seth placed the seed under Adam's tongue (or planted the branch over his grave) before burying him. A great tree sprouted from Adam's burial site. Over generations, its wood was passed down through biblical history—legend says it was used as Moses' staff, brought to Jerusalem by King David, and incorporated into a bridge by King Solomon. Centuries later, that same tree was felled and fashioned into the wooden cross used for Jesus' execution.

Tradition places Adam's burial site directly beneath Golgotha (Place of the Skull), meaning the blood of Jesus dripped down through the Cross onto the bones of Adam buried below. This legend creates a theological proportion: the instrument of mankind's fall became the instrument of its salvation. The sin brought into the world by the first Adam at the Tree of Knowledge was redeemed by Christ (the Last Adam) dying on a cross grown from that exact same tree. Again, this is not an explicit biblical teaching, but I liked this story.

When we look at the Cross, we see suffering. But when we look with the eyes of faith, we see love, sacrifice, forgiveness, and hope.

ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL

Building a community of believers is central to the mission of St. Joseph's School. In addition to honoring our rich heritage as a Catholic community, we took time this past week to connect with our students and their families through a Back-to-School PTO Playground Picnic. More than 80 adults and children gathered to share a meal, conversation, and time together in play. What a wonderful way to strengthen the bonds that make our school community so special!

At St. Joseph School, every morning starts with God. As a school body, we gather to remind one another that we are all Children of God. During the month of September, we are focusing on the virtue of **Faith**. Recently, our students participated in an investigation to determine whether a very sturdy chair would hold a 35-pound child. Just as the chair held true to its strength, so too does our faith in God hold us up during the storms of life. What a simple, yet powerful reminder for all of us!

A Bible verse of the week has also become a growing tradition during our Morning Gathering. This past week, we reflected on the words, **"Trust in the Lord with all your heart" (Proverbs 3:5)**. Students learned the importance of giving God 100% of their love, trust, and care. Each morning, these simple moments provide opportunities for our students to grow not only as learners, but also as children of God.

Thank you to the entire parish family for your ongoing support, prayers, encouragement, and generosity. **You make the mission of St. Joseph's School a living work of art, and for this, we are deeply grateful.**

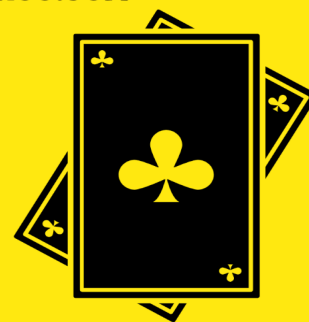
