MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

As we celebrated the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus last weekend, I also thought of sharing this wonderful story about a girl who died of joy after receiving the Holy Communion. At just five years old, a little girl in medieval Italy had one desire that consumed her heart: She wanted to receive Jesus in Holy Communion. Her name was Imelda Lambertini, and she lived in Bologna in the 1300s. While other children played games and dreamed of ordinary things, Imelda spent hours praying and thinking about Jesus.

Again and again, she begged to receive Holy Communion. But there was a problem. In those days, children were not permitted to receive Communion until they were much older. I received my First Holy Communion when I was in the seventh grade because that's how it is in India, even today.

At the age of nine, Imelda entered a Dominican convent. There, she devoted herself to prayer, penance, and meditation on Christ's Passion. Yet one longing remained. She wanted Jesus in the Eucharist. One day she asked them: "Tell me, sisters, can anyone receive Jesus in Holy Communion and not die?" The sisters were startled. "Why would you die?" they asked.

Imelda replied: "How is it possible to receive Jesus into one's heart and not die of love and joy?" Then came the Feast of the Ascension in 1333. As Mass ended, the sisters began leaving the chapel. Imelda remained behind, kneeling in prayer. Suddenly, something extraordinary happened. A radiant white Host appeared above her head, suspended in midair.

The astonished sisters rushed to call the priest. When he arrived, the Host descended onto a paten. Seeing this as a sign from Heaven, the priest immediately gave Imelda her First Holy Communion. At last, her greatest desire was fulfilled. The sisters left her alone to make her thanksgiving. Hours later, one of them returned to call her for dinner. There Imelda was still kneeling. A smile rested on her face. But when the sister gently touched her shoulder, Imelda fell forward. She was gone.

At only eleven years old, Blessed Imelda Lambertini had passed from this world shortly after receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. The child who once asked how anyone could receive Jesus and not die of love, and joy had found her answer. What do you think of this young girl? Have we ever experienced that kind of joy and love after receiving the Holy Communion? Is our soul hungering for Him as Blessed Imelda was? Blessed Imelda Lambertini, teach us to love Jesus as you loved Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

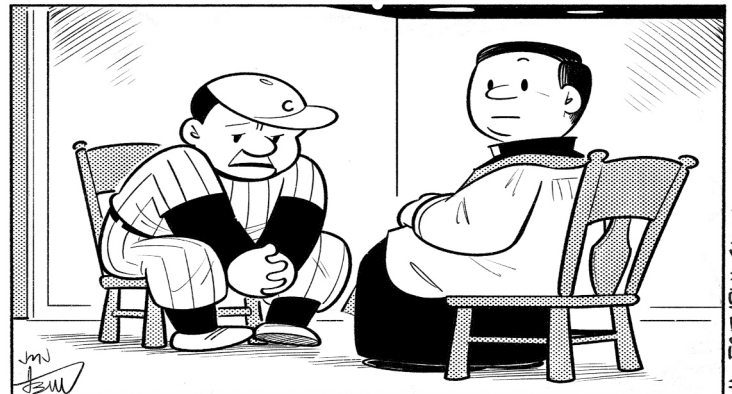
