

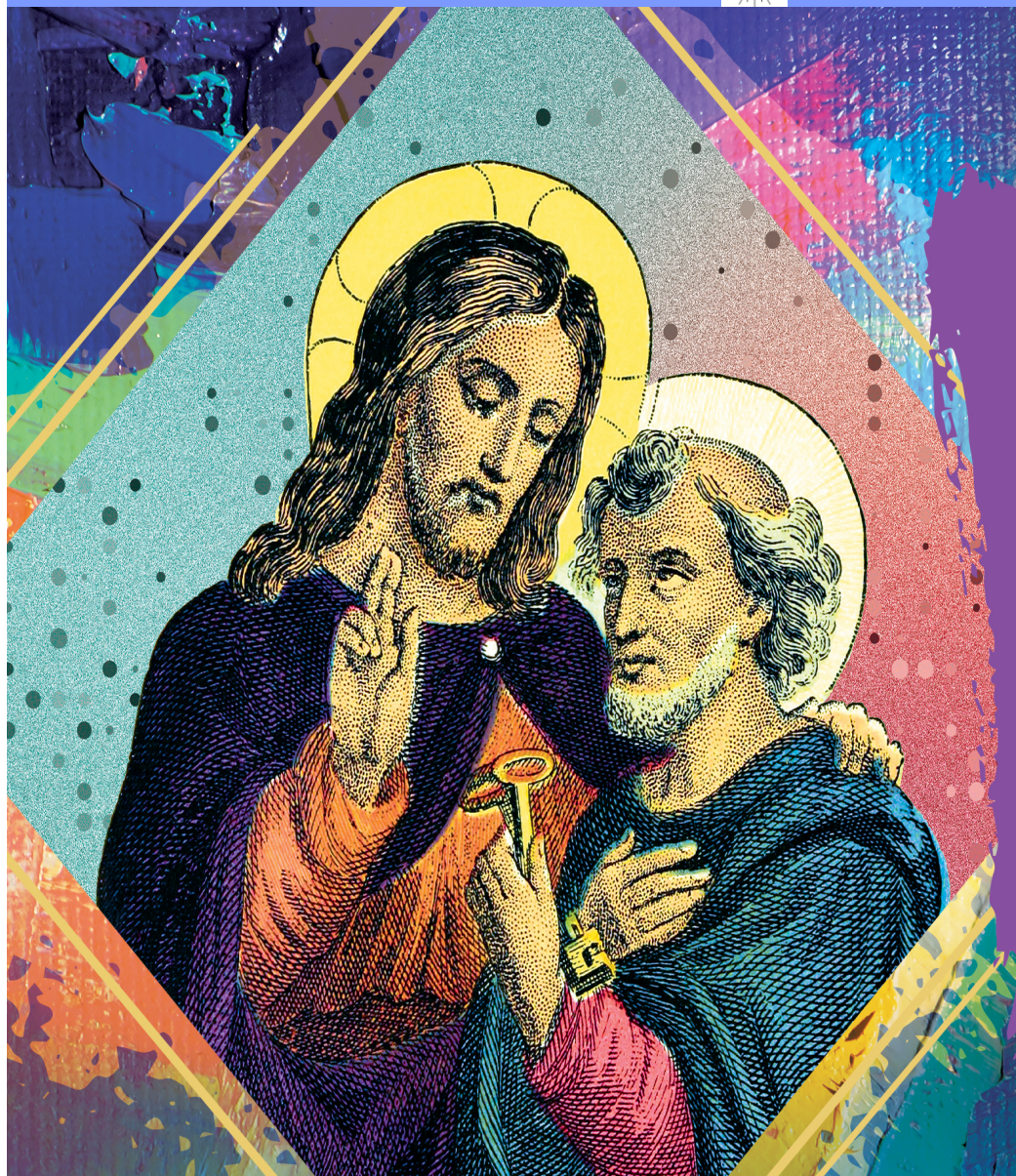

MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

The story takes us back to China after the Communist takeover. Catholics were being persecuted. Churches were attacked, religious objects were taken away, and priests and faithful people were arrested. According to the story told by Venerable Fulton Sheen, a Catholic priest was arrested while Communist soldiers entered his church. Then something terrible happened. The soldiers opened the tabernacle. They took out the Sacred Hosts and threw them on the floor.

The priest could do nothing. He could only watch and pray. But someone else saw what happened—a little girl. She had been taught that the Eucharist was not ordinary bread. She believed that Jesus Himself was truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. And so, she decided that she could not leave Jesus alone on the floor. Every Night, She Came Back. According to the story, there were 32 consecrated Hosts on the floor.

Every night, Little Li secretly returned to the church. She knelt before the Eucharist and spent about an hour praying. Think about that. She was only a child. She knew that soldiers were nearby. She knew she could be caught. She knew that entering the church could put her life in danger. But she came anyway. After praying for an hour, she carefully received one Sacred Host. Then she quietly left.

The next night, she came back. And the next night. For more than a month, this little girl continued her quiet mission of love. She did not fight the soldiers with weapons. She fought hatred with love. She answered disrespect with reverence. Every night, her actions seemed to say: “Jesus, I have not forgotten You.” The Last Host. Finally, only one Sacred Host remained.

It was the last night. Little Li entered the church again. She knelt before Jesus and spent her hour in prayer. Then she went to receive the last Host. As she bent down to receive Jesus, a soldier discovered her. A shot was fired. The little girl was killed. Her final Communion became her Viaticum—the food for her journey from this life to eternal life.

Her Story Changed a Priest. Years later, this story deeply touched the heart of Venerable Fulton J. Sheen. He became famous around the world for his preaching, books, radio programs, and television program Life Is Worth Living. But behind all his public ministry was a deep love for the Eucharist. He became known for spending a daily Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament.

The story of Little Li was a powerful inspiration for him. He saw something in that little girl that the world could not measure: She believed Jesus was worth everything. Her devotion to the Eucharist reminded him that the greatest treasure in this world is not money, success, comfort, or fame. The greatest treasure is Jesus Christ Himself. HAVE YOU EVER SPENT QUIET TIME BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT?

Sponsors needed for St. Joseph Parish and School Service Project

The local Rotary clubs have joined in partnership to serve the community in fighting hunger through meal-packing events. Since this partnership began in 2011, over 1.3 million meals have been packed locally. The primary beneficiary of these meals have been local food pantries, such as Stepping Stones and Feed My People Food Bank. Also through Stepping Stones, meals have been provided to the Boyceville and Colfax food pantries as well as the Share A Meal (SAM) program through the Menomonie School District. One great accomplishment of Rotary Feeds has been the ability to pack more meals than we need locally. In the past we've had a surplus of meals that have been donated to areas where disaster relief is needed both nationally, such as Houston after hurricane Harvey, and internationally like Nepal, Syria, and Haiti.

We hope to pack 12,000 meals costing \$3,000 on November 7th, 2026
