

#### MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

This happened in the year 1821 at the Parish of Le Chatelard, in the Archdiocese of Chambery, France. Two priests spent a week in praying, preaching and inviting their parishioners for a mission service, but the parishioners remained indifferent. Now those two priests, however, had to make a choice: either continue preaching or shake off the dust. The priests who were hopeful, zealous and committed, set out to the foot of the mountains to pray for the conversion of people.

'They have gone to pray & fast for your conversion' was the reply the curious parishioners received upon inquiry of their whereabouts. Prayer worked. Intercession proved powerful. The two priests were called back by the people and the mission in the parish resumed with much deep fervor and enthusiasm. One of the two missionaries was Fr Peter Marie Mermier, the founder of the Congregation of the Missionaries of St Francis de Sales. As it is said, "When the world says, 'Give up', Hope whispers, 'Try it one more time'."

Jesus leaves the northern area of Israel called Galilee and moves ahead to the southern area of Israel called Judea. The verse reads, "... He RESOLUTELY determined to journey to Jerusalem". All of us walk the Road to Jerusalem. Life with its hard challenges and unexpected troubles, life with its spiritual difficulties and luring temptations, life with its continual showers of unpleasantness and irritations and life with its allurements to bad habits and hard-to-give up pleasures. They are indeed a Road to Jerusalem.

But unless we make a strong resolute decision to walk through this Jerusalem Road, salvation and victory and happiness can never be ours. When Jesus decided to go ahead with resoluteness in His decision, He met with rejection. Samaritans would not welcome Him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem.

This is the reality of the world. When one makes a determined decision for life, one is faced with many challenges and oppositions. Life is a journey. On the journey there will be obstacles, even rejection. Sometimes companions may become stumbling blocks, but the journey must continue. If one road is closed, we must find another, always keeping the goal in sight.

Jesus does not waiver. He knows what lies ahead — misunderstanding, rejection, suffering — yet he presses on. That decisive movement is a challenge for us. There are many paths we could take; many distractions, comforts, fears that would divert us. But Christ calls us to a forward march—to clarity, to purpose. We are called to determine our direction: is it toward worldly success, ease, approval? Or is it toward the cross and resurrection, even if that path is difficult?

#### ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL

Our 5<sup>th</sup> grade class is the class of the month for October, which means that they participate daily in our morning announcements by leading the Pledge of Allegiance, sharing a faith fact, joke, and leading the birthday song every Monday. In October, schoolwide, we will concentrate on the virtue of Justice. Justice reminds us that each person is a beloved child of God and deserves to be treated with kindness, fairness, and respect. Sharing with a friend, speaking kindly, and including others in our play and conversations are ways our students learn to act justly. We guide our students to see that justice is not just about being fair, but about love in action. When we practice justice, we are imitating Jesus and reflecting His light to others.

Parent-teacher conferences will be held this week on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. These meetings are great opportunities for collaboration. Parent-teacher conferences foster open, direct communication, allowing teachers and parents to share insights about a child's progress, growth, strengths, and any improvements needed. We are so grateful for the wonderful families of our St. Joseph School community!
